Clearance of copyright is always the responsibility of the person wishing to publish or display materials. Any permission granted by the Butler Center for Arkansas Studies will be valid only to the extent that the Center holds rights in the material. It remains your responsibility as the requestor to guard against infringement of any rights *that may be held by someone other than the Butler Center.*

If you provide documentation that you conducted a reasonable inquiry and cannot locate a rights holder from whom permission could be obtained, and if you are willing to release the Central Arkansas Library System from any claim that the act of providing a copy infringed on a third party's rights, the Center may reasonably conclude that it should provide a copy.

A reasonable inquiry should include the following steps where applicable:

1. Ascertain whether the work might be in the public domain.
2. Inquire whether the Butler Center's accession records contain information about copyright holders.
3. Contact the author or the publisher by letter, telephone or e-mail.
4. Contact the U.S. Copyright Office at <http://lcweb.loc.gov/copyright/> for available information about copyright ownership.
5. Check with the library or other source for an alternative work that is either in the public domain or for which ownership can be more easily determined.

A reasonable inquiry that results in no identifiable or reachable copyright owner, coupled with a signed release form, may provide sufficient reassurance that our actions will not likely harm an unknown rights holder, and that you as the requestor will bear the risk of such harm, however remote it may be.
