

The Homestead Act of 1862

Went into effect January 1, 1863

Original Act signed on May 20, 1862

- Over the age of 21
- Never take up arms against the U.S.
- Former slaves, women and immigrants could file
- Show evidence of improvements for a period of 5 years

Application process

- Settle on the land
- File an application
- Improve the land
- File for Deed of title

Among the States and Territories Arkansas ranks fifth in the number of original homesteads entered from the passage of the homestead act May 20, 1862, to June 30, 1883. The grand total for Arkansas was 47,945. The number of homesteads entered in Arkansas for the fiscal year ended June 30, 1883, was 3,035,

What is a land patent?

Patents are the legal documents that transferred land ownership from the U.S. Government to individuals.

IN TOTAL 74,620 HOMESTEADERS WERE PROVED UP IN ARKANSAS. THE TOTAL ACREAGE OF HOMESTEADED LAND WAS 33,328,000 WHICH IS 24% OF THE LAND IN THE STATE.


